Rules and Regulations for Campers and Trade Rules

Official set up on Thursday June 24th beginning at 9 AM to 8 PM, Friday, June 25th gate opens at 7 AM to 8:30 AM for camp set up, Friday evening after 5:30 PM.

Early Bird set up, Wednesday, June 23rd for Thursday volunteers only.

The gate will only be open during the hours listed above, without exception! All vehicles MUST be out of the camp by 8:30 AM on Friday morning June 25th. No vehicles allowed in camp overnight Friday through Sunday.

We encourage all participants to come prepared to stay the entire weekend. Those who must leave early on Sunday morning may do so from 7 A.M. to 8:30 A.M.

Camp will break at 4:15 P.M. on Sunday.

All participants must be dressed in CORRECT period attire within the 1730 to 1790 span for the entire duration of this event. All period shelters must conform to replicate those in existence and commonly used during this historic period. These include, lean-tos, diamond shelters, marquees, wall and wedge tents only.

All camp furnishings such as stools, benches, chairs and tables as well as fire irons, grates and cookware and all lighting must be period correct for the time span listed above. **(If you have lighted candles and or a campfire you MUST have a full bucket of water available at all times within easy reach.)**

Campers are permitted to rope off their camps to prevent public from entering private spaces.

Campers must abide by COVID guidelines (masks) when distancing cannot be maintained.

Drunkenness will not be tolerated. QUIET TIME in the camp will be 11 P.M. to 7 A.M. and will be enforced.

NO MODERN FIREARMS ARE PERMITTED AT THIS EVENT. All flintlock firearms are ONLY to be discharged at the designated shooting range with the permission of a range officer.

Good firewood, 3 drinking water locations and straw will be provided as well as two porta-potty locations.

Each porta-potty location will have a washing station and a courtesy table with hand sanitizer, disinfectant spray, and disposable masks if you need one.

Pets: Dogs are permitted but be leashed at all times and curbed. Owner is fully responsible and liable for pet.

Livestock (horses, chickens, goats): Are allowed as long as they fulfill an interpretative function. Owner is fully responsible/liable for livestock and for cleaning up after.

Regular campers can set up a trade blanket in the designated TRADE BLANKET AREA only. All items upon a trade blanket must be period correct for the 1730 to 1790 period. Campers may also blanket trade in their camp area.

All Sutlers will be open for business during the hours of 9 A.M. to 5 P.M. on Friday & Saturday and 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. on Sunday.

Campers and public must respect an artisans/sutlers safe operating standards (# of public, etc.)

COVID Guidelines for Fort Loudoun Market Fair

CDC/PA Guidelines

- During the Market Fair Fort Loudoun Historic Site will be following the recommendations of the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in terms of COVID-19 Guidelines.
- Face masks are required when you cannot properly maintain distance from someone not from your household
- If you have a fever or sickness at the time of the event, please do not attend.
- By attending the event, you acknowledge that there is a chance and/or risk of contracting COVID-19.

Facilities

- Portable bathrooms will be available for you in two locations along with washing stations and a courtesy table of hand sanitizer, disinfectant spray and disposable masks if you would like one.
 - Disinfectant spray is for you to use on portable bathrooms, if you wish to use.
- The Museum and Gift Shop in the Patton House will have set hours of operation.

Camping

- Campers (solo and groups) are allowed to rope off their camps in order to provide a barrier to keep uninvited out of private spaces.

Sutlers/Artisans' Stores

- Each artisan/sutler's tent is a business which may have differing rules for entering tent to do business.
- Please note that artisans may require masks for entry into their business.
- Artisans may also have maximum capacity rules for their tent size.
- Please be respectful of the artisan's business and rules.

Individual Shooting Matches

Candle Match

Friday, June 25th, dusk at designated range.

Friday evening Candle Shoot will begin at dusk about 8:30 P.M. You need it dark to see the flame on the top of the candles. The candle is placed in a card board box on its side. The candle is lit and the object is to shoot out the flame without hitting the candle. If you hit the candle you must replace the candle with another.

Each shooter should attend the shoot with some candles to replace any they may hit.

There will be a prize for the top shooter.

Individual Match

Saturday, June 26th, Following the Governor's Cup

The following information is for those shooters who wish to participate in the separate shooting matches as individual shooters, and not part of the Governors Cup competition. These shooting matches will consist of novelty targets, board shoots, and more.

1. Each paper target will be a five shot target having only five shots fired at it. If a shooter misses one or more of the shots at the paper target those missed shots will be included as part of the five shots fired.
2. Half Ball Rule, at least half of the round ball's diameter must be in the scoring area of the paper target to be counted for a score. If half the ball or more is in the higher scoring area, that score will be counted for that shot.
3. Any paper target having more than five shots on it will be disqualified as a valid paper target.
4. The five shots per target must take place in the time allotted for each relay. (20 minutes)

Novelty Match

1. The Novelty Match will consist of ten targets, one shot to be fired at each target.
2. The turkey feather and the poker card MUST be cut in two separate pieces.
3. The "X" strings must be cut in two.
4. All other targets must have some sign of being damaged by the round ball.

Safety rules of the NMLRA will be in effect for these matches.

The judgement of any range officer is final!

Fort Loudoun Governors Firelock Match

The Governors Firelock match competition is open to any reenacting units depicting a military unit from the 1730s through 1790.

Units wishing to compete must be pre-registered no later than May 14, 2021 for this firelock shooting event to be held Saturday afternoon June 26th at the Fort Loudoun Market Fair.

The Governor's Cup Match will begin Saturday, June 26th at 1PM

For the purpose of fairness in this competition, each unit is to select six persons under arms to represent that unit in the shooting and marching portions of this event. The same six persons along with their respective commanding officer will compete and represent their unit on the range.

Muskets, Fusils, Smoothbores and rifles must be of flintlock ignition and of the 1730-1790 timeframe.

EACH SHOOTER MUST HAVE A FLASHGUARD AND FRIZZEN STALL ON THEIR FIRELOCK TO PARTICIPATE.

Units that participate will be expected to load with pre-rolled paper cartridges (consisting of a single round ball) from a cartridge box or a period shot pouch and powder horn with measurer for all matches. Load from your person, no shooting boxes!

Each unit under the command of their respective officer, will be required to exercise their abilities in marching (unloaded) and firing of volleys (FOR SCORE) on the range.

All units will receive a TOTAL SCORE at the end of the day's competition. This is an aggregate score from the shooting match, Governor's Inspection, and a score for the marching and volley fire portion of the event.

The Governors Cup will be awarded to the winning unit at the end of the day's competition.

For all other unit members and individual campers who wish to shoot, there will be separate flintlock rifle and smoothbore matches with prizes. Half ball rule applies to all matches and the range officers' word is final.

Please bring signed group volunteer form from Officer's Packet.

We will be abiding by the safety standards and range rules of the National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association. You are responsible for reviewing and understanding the "Range Safety" (p. 1-2) and "Range Rules and Regulations" (p. 3-6) sections within document: <https://www.nmlra.org/rules>
