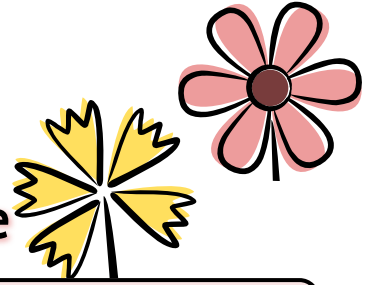

Lunch will be provided!

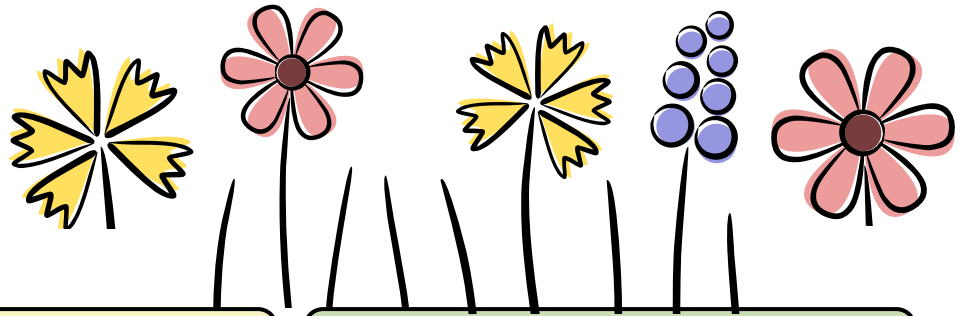


### Preserving Our Shared History
